SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

BACKGROUND: Summary

The Riverside County Board of Supervisors is advocating for the protection of Medi-Cal (California's version of Medicaid), which serves over 1 million residents in the county, including low-income individuals, children, seniors, and people with disabilities. Medi-Cal provides critical healthcare services, with high utilization among children aged 5-12.

The resolution expresses strong opposition to any federal Medicaid cuts, which could jeopardize funding for local hospitals, Federally Qualified Health Centers, and in-home supportive services (IHSS). Cuts to Medi-Cal could lead to hospital closures, longer wait times, and reduced access to essential healthcare.

The Board calls on Congress to oppose federal budget cuts that would reduce Medi-Cal funding and pledges to continue advocating for healthcare access and services for Riverside County's most vulnerable populations.

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COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE RESOLUTION NUMBER 2025-115 A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE TO SUPPORT MEDICAID FUNDING

9 WHEREAS, Riverside County is home to over 2.4 million residents, many of whom rely on
10 vital medical services to ensure their health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, access to healthcare is essential to the prosperity of individuals, families, and communities within Riverside County, and ensuring that all residents, regardless of their background or economic status, receive appropriate medical care is a fundamental obligation of local government; and

WHEREAS, Medicaid is the federal healthcare program for low-income individuals, and in California, this program is known as "Medi-Cal"; therefore, throughout this resolution, the terms Medicaid and Medi-Cal are used interchangeably to refer to the same essential program that provides healthcare to over one million Riverside County residents; and

WHEREAS, Medi-Cal is a critical source of healthcare coverage for low-income individuals,
children, disabled persons, and the elderly, ensuring that some of Riverside County's most
vulnerable populations have access to life-saving medical care; and

22 WHEREAS, Riverside County has more than 1 million Medi-Cal enrollees, representing 42% 23 of the county's population, all of whom deserve access to high-quality healthcare; and

WHEREAS, Medi-Cal spending brings hundreds of millions of dollars into Riverside University
 Health System each year, supporting local healthcare infrastructure, services, and economic
 activity; and

27 28 WHEREAS, these Medi-Cal funds are at risk of significant cuts in the proposed federal
 budget, which could have a devastating impact on the residents of Riverside County, especially
 those relying on Medi-Cal for their healthcare; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County hospitals heavily depend on Medi-Cal reimbursement, and the
proposed federal Medicaid cuts would severely affect their ability to continue to provide highquality care to all county residents; and

WHEREAS, all of the Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) in Riverside County rely
on Medi-Cal revenue to serve low-income communities, and the proposed cuts would impact their
ability to provide essential health services to vulnerable populations; and

WHEREAS, the reduction in Medi-Cal funding could lead to hospital and clinic closures,
longer wait times, and decreased access to preventive and primary care services, negatively
affecting both health outcomes and economic stability in Riverside County; and

WHEREAS, Medi-Cal also significantly contributes funds to In-Home Supportive Services
(IHSS), which help elderly and disabled residents stay in their homes rather than move to more
expensive institutional care facilities, providing crucial support to some of the county's most
vulnerable individuals; and

WHEREAS, Medi-Cal supports Regional Centers and Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)
for children with physical and learning disabilities, helping them succeed in school and beyond,
contributing to their independence and well-being; and

20 WHEREAS, in Riverside County alone, 375,000 children under 19 and 77,000 seniors over 21 the age of 65 rely on Medi-Cal

WHEREAS, the highest utilization of Medi-Cal services is in children ages 5-12 in Riverside
County

WHEREAS, Riverside County has a vested interest in ensuring the health and safety of all its
residents and recognizes that the well-being of its community is directly tied to the availability and
sustainability of healthcare services for its most vulnerable members;

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WHEREAS, Riverside County urges legislators to recognize the extraordinary need for Medi Cal in our region and to prioritize continued and increased funding in response to the growing
 healthcare demands of our communities;

WHEREAS, Riverside County stands ready to support and continue working collaboratively with our federal partners on efforts that invest in critical infrastructure, public safety, healthcare, and economic development, all of which contribute to long-term fiscal stability and prosperity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County, California, as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors strongly opposes any cuts to the federal Medicaid system, which provides critical funding for Medi-Cal, and calls on the federal government to protect Medi-Cal funding for Riverside County and its residents.

2. The Board of Supervisors calls on the U.S. Congress to vote against any budget that includes cuts to Medicaid funding, including cuts to reimbursement rates, block grants, work requirements, or any other mechanisms that would reduce funding to Medi-Cal or undermine its effectiveness.

3. The Board of Supervisors affirms its commitment to advocating for the continued funding of Medi-Cal and to ensuring that all Riverside County residents, particularly those most in need, have access to high-quality healthcare services.

4. The Board of Supervisors further directs County staff to actively engage with state and federal officials to advocate for the protection of Medi-Cal and the services it funds, and to explore other funding opportunities to ensure the health and safety of Riverside County residents.

5. The Board of Supervisors directs the County to continue working with local healthcare providers, advocacy groups, and community organizations to ensure that Riverside County remains a leader in providing equitable healthcare access and services for all residents.
