BACKGROUND:

Summary

Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts (EIFDs) were introduced by the California Legislature from 2014-2015, enabling a new model for financing infrastructure and economic development in California. Government Code Sections 53398.50 through 53398.88 (EIFD law) authorize EIFDs to finance public capital facilities. The available revenue can be the increment of property tax and vehicle license fees resulting from growth within the established boundary, starting from the Fiscal Year after the EIFD is formally established. An EIFD therefore does not result in an increase to existing taxes, or a new tax imposed on property owners. Additionally, tax revenue increment from school districts and community college districts are not available for use by an EIFD; however, other affected taxing entities may choose to participate upon completion of a tax sharing agreement. As stated in detail in the attached Notice of Exemption, establishing an EIFD is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) or is exempt from CEQA, pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 21065, 15378, and 15061(b)(3).

EIFD law provides that EIFDs shall be governed by a public financing authority (PFA), which is established by Board of Supervisors' resolution. The PFA consists of three members of the Board of Supervisors and two public members; the term of PFA members is four years. The PFA is a separate legal entity, and their meetings and other actions are subject to the Brown Act, Public Records Act, and Political Reform Act. The PFA, not the Board of Supervisors, determines future decisions pertaining to an EIFD.

By passing attached Resolution Nos. 2025-118 and 2025-119, the County Board of Supervisors would begin the process of creating the Cabazon EIFD. The following steps outline the process:

1. The first phase involves preparation of a draft infrastructure financing plan (IFP), which outlines the proposed district's estimated tax revenue as well as the use of the monies. Regional or communitywide benefits such as infrastructure for water and wastewater, transportation, flood control, and fire suppression will be considered within the EIFD boundary.
2. Staff then distribute the draft IFP to all property owners within the proposed EIFD boundary and hold a public meeting with local businesses and property owners to present the EIFD, answer questions, and gather feedback.
3. The PFA conducts its first public hearing with presentation of the IFP and consideration of all written and oral comments. The PFA may reject, or direct revisions to the draft IFP as necessary.
4. The PFA conducts its second public hearing, at which all written and oral protests received are considered, along with the recommendations of affected taxing entities. If less than 25% of the combined number of landowners and residents in the proposed EIFD area who are at least 18 years of age file a protest, the PFA may consider passage of a resolution to adopt the draft IFP at the conclusion of the second public hearing.

5. Staff file a Request for Jurisdictional Boundary Change with the State Board of Equalization by December 1, 2025, thereby creating a new Tax Rate Area(s) that includes the EIFD.

If all these steps are completed by December 1, 2025, Fiscal Year 25-26 will be the base year for the Cabazon EIFD, and all increases in assessed valuation starting in Fiscal Year 26-27 will be included in the *ad valorem* property tax increment and the motor vehicle license fee increment.

Cabazon Background

The unincorporated community of Cabazon is located on the eastern portion of the Riverside County area known as "The Pass". More specifically, Cabazon includes area located on both sides of Interstate 10 (excluding the Morongo Indian Reservation), immediately east of the City of Banning, west of the unincorporated area of Whitewater, with the San Bernardino National Forest to the south. Cabazon is a rural community with a population of more than 2,000 residents; a large number of residences and mobile homes are located south of the Union Pacific rail line, with higher density housing and commercial uses in a small core area north of Main Street. With the development of Interstate 10, the area's commercial and tourist uses moved to the north side of the freeway.

Cabazon is currently classified as a disadvantaged unincorporated community per the SB244 definition; it faces deficits in growth facilitating critical infrastructure, including sewer, flood control, transportation, and fire suppression. Historically, the community has expressed concerns regarding infrastructure issues that affect most growing communities, including reducing flood hazards, increased area accessibility and improved railroad crossings, and revitalization of the historic main street to accommodate local residents' and tourists' needs.

Establishment of a Cabazon EIFD could create a powerful tool for generating revenue to implement community infrastructure and stimulate economic growth. Additionally, a Cabazon EIFD may not only generate revenue through collection of property tax increment, without increasing existing taxes or creating new taxes, but it could also make the area more competitive for receipt of state and federal grants, and private sector investment.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Establishment of the Cabazon Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District will not result in any new taxes or fees to the area's property owners. A portion of increment revenue from increases in property value from resale and development of area properties will be allocated for infrastructure projects with community-wide and economic benefits.

8 WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California enacted California Government Code
9 Sections 53398.50 through 53398.88 (“EIFD Law”); which authorizes the legislative body of a county to
10 establish an enhanced infrastructure financing district and use specified property tax increment revenue
11 generated within such districts to finance certain infrastructure and community benefit projects; and,

12 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53398.59 of the Government Code, such proceedings shall
13 be instituted by the adoption of a resolution of intention to establish an enhanced infrastructure financing
14 district; and,

15 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside (“Board of Supervisors”)
16 constitutes that legislative body that is authorized to institute proceedings for the establishment of an
17 enhanced infrastructure financing district; and,

18 WHEREAS, the County of Riverside is in compliance with the prerequisite requirements for
19 forming an enhanced infrastructure financing district (EIFD) enumerated in Government Code Section
20 53398.54; and,

21 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to designate a proposed EIFD in the County
22 of Riverside’s unincorporated area of Cabazon, located between the City of Banning and the unincorporated
23 area of Whitewater, as detailed on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board
25 of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on May 20, 2025, at 9:30 am or
26 soon thereafter in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors located on the 1st floor of the County
27 Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, as follows:

1 Section 1. The Board of Supervisors proposes to establish an enhanced infrastructure
2 financing district under the terms of the EIFD Law.

3 Section 2. The name of the proposed enhanced infrastructure financing district shall be the
4 “Cabazon Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District” (the “District”).

5 Section 3. The boundaries of the proposed District shall consist of the territory located in
6 the County of Riverside included within the boundaries as shown on the boundary map attached hereto as
7 Exhibit A.

8 Section 4. The type of public facilities and development proposed to be financed or assisted
9 by the District are as described in Government Code Section 53398.52, including but not limited to the
10 planning, design and construction of infrastructure in the unincorporated Riverside County territory area of
11 Cabazon and more particularly described in the infrastructure financing plan (IFP).

12 Section 5. The District is necessary to support the provision of needed public infrastructure
13 identified in the IFP and to promote economic development within the District. The Board of Supervisors
14 authorizes the District to use incremental property tax revenue from the County of Riverside to finance the
15 lawful, authorized activities of the District. Any such use of incremental property tax revenue must be
16 approved by resolution pursuant to Government Code Section 53398.68.

17 Section 6. The Board of Supervisors hereby fixes September 9, 2025, at 9:30 am, or as soon
18 thereafter, in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors, located on the first floor of the County
19 Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, 92501, as the time and place for a public
20 hearing on this proposal as required by Government Code Section 53398.59(f).

21 Section 7. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the County’s Executive Officer, or his
22 designee, to prepare a proposed IFP in accordance with Government Code Section 53398.63.

23 Section 8. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
24 to mail either a copy of this resolution or a single page notice of intention to each owner of land within the
25 District and to each affected taxing entity (as that term is defined in Government Code Section 53398.51),
26 pursuant to Government Code Sections 53398.60 and 53398.61.

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1 Section 9. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
2 to send a copy of this resolution to the public financing authority (PFA) that is to be established at the same
3 time that this resolution is adopted.

4 Section 10. The County of Riverside in its sole capacity as the designated successor agency
5 to the former Redevelopment Agency of the County of Riverside has received a finding of completion, as
6 specified in California Health and Safety Code Section 34179.7.

7 Section 11. In accordance with Government Code Section 53398.54, the County of
8 Riverside certifies to the California Department of Finance (DOF) and to the PFA that no former
9 Redevelopment Agency of the County of Riverside (Former RDA) assets that are the subject of litigation
10 involving the State of California, where the County of Riverside or the Successor Agency are a named
11 plaintiff, have been or will be used to benefit any efforts of the District. The County's Clerk of the Board
12 of Supervisors is authorized and directed on behalf of the County of Riverside to provide or make this
13 certification to the DOF within 10 days after the date of adoption of this resolution, by delivery of a copy
14 of this resolution or signing a separate certification, if and as required by the DOF.

15 Section 12. The State Controller has completed its review as specified in California Health
16 and Safety Code Section 34167.5 of asset transfers between the former RDA, the County of Riverside, or
17 any other public agency. The Successor Agency and the County of Riverside have complied with all of the
18 State Controller's findings and orders stemming from such review.

19 Section 13. If any provision of this resolution, or the application of such provision to any
20 person or circumstances, shall be invalid, the remainder of this resolution, or the application of such
21 provision to person or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected
22 thereby.

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



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5 **BOUNDARY MAP**

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
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

8 WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California enacted California Government Code
9 Sections 53398.50 through 53398.88 (“EIFD Law”); which authorizes the legislative body of a county to
10 establish an enhanced infrastructure financing district and use specified property tax increment revenue
11 generated within such districts to finance certain infrastructure and community benefit projects; and,

12 WHEREAS, pursuant to EIFD Law, a public financing authority, which is the governing
13 board of an enhanced infrastructure financing district, must be established at the same time a legislative
14 body adopts a resolution of intention to establish an enhanced infrastructure financing district; and,

15 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside (“Board of Supervisors”)
16 is concurrently adopting Resolution No. 2025-118, a resolution of intention to establish the Cabazon
17 Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District (the “District”); and,

18 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to establish a public financing authority to
19 govern the District.

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board
21 of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on May 20, 2025, at 9:30 am or
22 soon thereafter in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors located on the 1st floor of the County
23 Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, as follows:

24 Section 1. Establishment. The Board of Supervisors hereby establishes a public financing
25 authority to be the governing board of the District.

26 Section 2. Name. The name of the proposed public financing authority shall be the
27 “Cabazon EIFD Public Financing Authority” (the “Authority”).

1 **Section 3. Relationship.** As provided by EIFD Law, the Authority shall be a public entity
2 separate from the County of Riverside. The debt, liabilities and obligations of the Authority shall not
3 constitute debts, liabilities or obligations of the County of Riverside.

4 **Section 4. Members.** The Board of Supervisors hereby appoints Supervisor Yxstian
5 Gutierrez, Supervisor Jose Medina, Supervisor V. Manuel Perez, and public members Sarah Wargo and
6 Elena Baca-Santa Cruz to serve as the initial members of the Authority.

7 **Section 5. Term.** The term of appointment for each public member shall be four (4) years
8 from the adoption date of this resolution. The term for each Board of Supervisor shall be determined on an
9 annual basis as the Board reappoints committee members beginning in 2026 and thereafter.

10 **Section 6. Vacancies.** In the event of a member vacancy, whether by the expiration of term
11 of appointment or otherwise, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a new member to fill the vacated
12 position. If a public member vacancy occurs prior to the expiration of the term of appointment of the
13 vacating public member, the appointee who fills that vacancy shall serve for the remaining term of the
14 vacating public member.

15 **Section 7. Organization.** The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs the
16 Authority to adopt such bylaws, rules, regulations, and procedures as the Authority requires or desires for
17 the proper performance of its duties. Any such actions shall be in accordance with all applicable laws,
18 including but not limited to the Ralph M. Brown Act, the California Public Records Act, and the Political
19 Reform Act of 1974.

20 **Section 8. Compensation and Expense Reimbursement.** Pursuant to Government Code
21 Section 53398.51.1(c), the members of the Authority are prohibited from receiving compensation for the
22 performance of their duties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, members of the Authority may receive
23 reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties if such
24 reimbursement is authorized by the Authority or complies with applicable laws.

25 **Section 9. Authority.** Pursuant to Government Code Section 53398.51.1(e), the Authority is
26 a local public agency subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act, the California Public Records Act, and the
27 Political Reform Act of 1974. Furthermore, and pursuant to Government Code Section 53398.51.1(d), the
28

1 members of the Authority are subject to the ethics training rules of Title 5, Division 2, Part 1, Chapter 2,
2 Article 2.4 of the Government Code.

3 Section 10. County Assistance. The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Chief
4 Executive Officer of the County of Riverside, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the County Counsel,
5 their designees, and any other county employees as directed by their department heads, to assist the
6 Authority in carrying out the purposes of this resolution and the proposed formation and operation of the
7 District, which the Board of Supervisors hereby determines to serve a direct and substantial public purpose.
8 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Authority remains a legally constituted governmental entity separate
9 and distinct from the County of Riverside.

10 Section 11. Severability. If any provision of this resolution, or the application of such
11 provision to any person or circumstances, shall be invalid, the remainder of this resolution, or the application
12 of such provision to person or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid, shall not be
13 affected thereby.




