

BACKGROUND:

The Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports the development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that more than 50% of the WDB's members must come from the business community. In addition, WDB's are required to have representation from universities or community colleges, economic development, and workforce representatives including labor organizations. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official, is responsible for appointing WDB members for two-year terms.

Mr. Andrew McDuffie is the Vice President at California Bank & Trust, with over seven years of experience in commercial and retail banking. Known for his expertise in business development, financial analysis, and relationship management, Mr. McDuffie plays a vital role in the driving success at California Bank & Trust.
