BACKGROUND:

Summary

On November 8, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved Agenda Item 3.4 a joint exercise of powers agreement for Riverside County to join the California County Assessors' Information Technology Authority with the objective of collaborating on the design of technological programs to assist in the uniform application of property assessments.

Since the Authority's inception, the ACR has actively participated and expended considerable departmental resources in the development of the project's scope and initial development phases. The department has now determined that it is in the best interest of the County to withdraw from the Authority, and any future participation in Authority efforts will be made as a non-member agency.

Upon the Board's approval of this request, the ACR will submit a formal notice of withdrawal from Riverside County to the Authority in accordance with the provisions outlined in the joint exercise of powers agreement and in substantially the form as shown as attached hereto as Attachment A.
