

BACKGROUND:

Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports the expansion and development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that more than 50% of the WDB's members must come from the business community. In addition, WDBs are required to have representation from universities or community colleges, economic development, and workforce representatives including labor organizations. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official, is responsible for appointing the WDB members for two-year terms.

Ms. Mary Jo Ramirez, Executive Director of California Family Life Center (CFLC) has worked for CFLC for 31 years. She advocates and presents issues for at-risk children, youth, and families to generate and gain community support and funding. She is passionate about providing the highest quality of services to assist youth in becoming productive and self-sufficient adults. Her experience and career efforts include being

actively involved in creating opportunities for economic, social, and community development.

She oversees the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) Youth Programs, CFLC's Foster Family, Group Homes, Kin Care, Riverside County Youth Build Program and Community Recidivism Reduction program with clarity of mission, values, strategies, objectives, and priorities to assist vulnerable children and youth. She is very involved in the community and participates on many committees and boards in various roles. She has been serving on the Riverside County WDB since 2016.

Ms. Ramirez has expressed interest in continuing to serve on the WDB as a Public Sector Youth Organization Representative for All Districts. If reappointed, she will serve a two-year term commencing August 18, 2025, and expiring August 18, 2027.
