BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Ability Counts, Inc. (\$3,000.00) will support employment and community inclusion programs for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Funding will help sustain the Day Program, Supported Employment Program (SEP), and Individual Placement (IP), which provide training, job coaching, and placement services.
2. The donation to the Lake Elsinore Historical Society (\$4,000.00) will support the "Lake Elsinore History Days" event, which engages the community through

interactive exhibits and activities that preserve, celebrate, and share the area's rich cultural heritage.

3. The donation to the Temescal Heritage Foundation (\$1,000.00) will benefit the Daniel, Drake and Jacob Memorial Scholarship Fund which was established after the tragic deaths of three local high schoolers in 2020. Graduating seniors from Santiago, Centennial and Woodcrest Christian High Schools will be the annual awards recipients.
4. The donation to the Inland Empire Blue Belles (\$1,000.00) will provide support to law enforcement families in Riverside County facing hardship due to death, injury, or illness.
5. The donation to Rebirth Homes (\$4,000.00) will support the Victim to Survivor Program by installing a security system in the Traditional Housing Program home in Corona. The security system will ensure that participants living on the property will be safe from potential threats, including protection for individuals who may have been in a trafficking situation.
6. The donation to U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps., Paul Revere Division (\$4,000.00) will support the uniform and training fund for the cadets. The funds will be used to purchase regulation uniforms for new cadets to ensure that they can fully participate in training, community service, and ceremonial duties.
7. The donation to the Tom Wathen Center (\$1,500.00) will support the Veterans Celebration at Flabob Airport which provides an opportunity for community members to become acquainted with the airport and its programs.
8. The donation to Kidz Come First (\$2,000.00) will support the Christmas Kindness Drive to provide food boxes, clothes, blankets and toys to homeless and low-income families throughout Jurupa Valley.
9. The donation to the City of Canyon Lake (\$1,500.00) will support the State of the City event which brings together residents, businesses, and local organizations to learn about city priorities, upcoming projects, and opportunities for civic engagement. This event fosters transparency in local government, promotes economic development partnerships, and strengthens community collaboration.
10. The donation to the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce (\$1,500.00) will support The State of the City to continue to strengthen local businesses and organizations, foster economic growth, and promote community engagement. By investing in the Chamber's efforts, this funding helps create opportunities for collaboration and resources that benefit both businesses and residents across the City of Eastvale.
11. The donation to the Jurupa Valley Citizens Patrol (\$4,000.00) will fund a refurbished 40-foot storage container to house essential equipment and supplies. This includes barricades, lighting, signage, and other safety materials used by volunteers during their public safety and community service duties.
