**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

The FY2025 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Equipment and Training Program administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is accepting Requests for Projects. A total of \$30 million dollars has been allocated to the counties of California with Riverside County to receive a maximum of \$1,920,050 determined by a population-based formula.

The Riverside County Sheriff's Office (RSO) is currently evaluating equipment and technology projects that will enhance operational capabilities and improve the delivery of services to the residents of Riverside County.

The proposed resolution is a required component of the project submittal process and authorizes RSO to participate in the Fiscal Year 2025 program. Should the proposed project be awarded funding, RSO will return to the Board of Supervisors to submit the grant award documents for formal approval.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

The submittal of the project proposal and the approval of Resolution No. 2025-227 will have no adverse impact on the residents or businesses of Riverside County.


