**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Victory Outreach Riverside**, founded in 1979, is a faith-based nonprofit serving families affected by addiction, poverty, and broken homes. The \$2,500 grant will support its 2025 Turkey Dinner Project, providing complete Thanksgiving meals to over 100 low-income families in Riverside’s District 1. Funds will be used to purchase turkeys and side items, helping families celebrate with dignity and community.
2. **The Rotary Club of Perris** focuses on youth through scholarships, dictionary distributions, and global service projects with Rotary International. Each year, the club awards scholarships to more than a dozen graduating high school students in Perris. The scholarships provide critical support, helping local students access higher education. The \$2,500 grant will continue funding this scholarship program for students in the first district.
3. **Perris Union High School**, the Student of the Month (SOM) program, administered by the Perris Union High School District, honors college, vocational, and trade school-bound seniors for their character, academics, service, and perseverance. From September through May, students are recognized at monthly breakfasts, culminating in the Student of the Year Scholarship Banquet each spring. The program fosters community values of God, Country, Family, Community, and Free Enterprise while celebrating student achievement. The \$2,500 funds requested will support scholarships

and program events that recognize and encourage these outstanding students.

4. **Riverside Free Clinic, (RFC)** grew from a student-led initiative to providing free medical services for homeless and uninsured individuals into a comprehensive clinic offering medical, dental, mental health, pharmaceutical, and nursing care through partnerships with local universities. The clinic is requesting a \$2,500 grant funding to support a new diabetes education and treatment program, providing glucose monitoring, medications, equipment, and health education on nutrition, exercise, and stress management. This program aims to prevent prediabetic patients from developing diabetes and help current diabetic patients manage their A1C levels effectively.
5. **Catholic Charities San Bernardino and Riverside Counties** is a comprehensive nonprofit that addresses poverty and inequality through food assistance, healthcare access, counseling, immigration services, workforce development, and disaster relief. Rooted in Catholic social teaching, the organization partners with parishes, public agencies, and community partners to serve vulnerable families across the Inland Empire. The \$2,500 funds will support its Hunger Relief Program, which provides nutritious food, CalFresh enrollment assistance, and nutrition education to low-income families. All funds will be used to purchase high-quality food items for distribution at the Riverside Regional Center in District 1 in the Casablanca Area, directly reducing food insecurity and strengthening community resilience
6. **Riverside Meals on Wheels**, established in 1972, provides seniors, disabled, and homebound neighbors' nutritious meals, friendly visits, and safety checks. The organization delivers more than 36,000 meals annually to over 150 individuals, following California senior nutrition guidelines. The "Together, We Can Deliver" Fresh Meals Program provides affordable, fresh meals five days a week. Riverside Meals on Wheels is requesting \$2,500 to support operations for residents in Riverside's District 1, helping keep meal costs low and accessible for those in need.
7. **County of Riverside -IHSS Public Authority** is requesting grant funding to support its annual Caregiver Appreciation Event, which honors caregivers who provide essential services to older adults and individuals with disabilities. The \$2,000 funds will be used to help cover event costs for the November 18, 2025, event including the venue, supplies, event swag, and printed marketing materials. The event will bring together 450-500 caregivers and community partners for recognition, training presentations, a resource fair, and a luncheon, highlighted by a proclamation from the Riverside County Board of Supervisors.
8. **Inlandia Institute** is a literary organization serving California's Inland Empire, dedicated to promoting inclusive storytelling and cultural engagement across a diverse 29,000-square-mile region. They are requesting funding to support the inaugural Riverside Book Festival, scheduled for October 11, 2025, which aims to attract 5,000 attendees and celebrate community voices through literature and the arts. The \$2,500 grant would cover essential infrastructure costs such as traffic control, safety measures, and stage setup to ensure accessibility and safety for all participants.
9. **The Jurupa Valley Citizen Patrol Program** operates out of the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station and provides vital supplemental services to the community, including traffic control, patrol assignments, and assistance during accidents and natural disasters. The \$2,500 will help purchase and install a cargo bed slide for a volunteer truck, improving efficiency and safety during operations.

10. **Riverside University Health System Foundation** is a nonprofit organization that supports RUHS by raising funds and awareness to ensure quality health care for Riverside County residents, especially vulnerable populations. Its signature fundraising event, the annual Festival of Trees, brings thousands of community members together at the Riverside Convention Center to enjoy holiday activities and decorated trees. The \$8,500 funds requested will directly support children's health services, including the Pediatric Unit, PICU, NICU, and the Child Abuse & Neglect Unit. This year's festival will focus on supporting children treated in the Trauma Department, which cares for more than 200 young patients annually.
  
11. **The Riverside Museum Associates (RMA)**, founded in 1963, is a nonprofit organization that supports the Museum of Riverside in preserving and sharing the region's history. RMA provides volunteers, outreach, and fundraising to help the Museum care for collections, present educational programs, and highlight Riverside's cultural heritage. The nonprofit is requesting funding for the Moon Festival that will be celebrated on October 6, 2025, at the Museum of Riverside's Heritage House. The event will celebrate the Asian culture and will honor the contributions of Chinese and Asian Americans to Riverside's history. The \$2,500 funds will support cultural performance, storytelling, and educational activities that promote diversity, inclusion, and historical awareness.
