**BACKGROUND:**

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Valley Resource Center Inc.-** \$10,000- The funding will support Art in the Park – Murrieta, a program, designed for adults with disabilities, that provides participants with a safe and supportive environment to explore their creativity, enhance self-esteem, and encourages communication and collaboration.
2. **Temecula Valley Chamber of Commerce-** \$1,000- The funding supports the Temecula Student of the Month Program, which assists high school seniors with college tuition through scholarships.
3. **County of Riverside IHSS-Public Authority-** \$2,500- The funding will support the 2025 IHSS Caregiver Appreciation Event, an event that recognizes caregivers who provide essential services to older adults and individuals with disabilities.
4. **Treasure Box Angels-**\$5,000- The funding will support the 2025 Christmas Wish Tree Dinner, an event that provides a holiday meal and toys to families with children undergoing treatment for serious medical conditions in the hospital.
5. **Pearl Center for Creative Arts-** \$2,000- The funding will be used to support the 2025 Lace and Locomotives, an event that raises community engagement and celebrates local military history.
6. **Western Center Community Foundation-**\$10,000- The funding will support the Science Exploration Experience, a program that provides students with hands-on science workshops and opportunities to engage in fossil research.
7. **God's Fan Club-**\$10,000- The funding will be used to provide transitional housing, food, and basic necessities to individuals experiencing homelessness and domestic violence.
8. **Habitat for Humanity Inland Valley-**\$30,000- The funding will be used to support the Home Preservation Program, a program that provides minor home repairs and improvements to residents.
9. **MilVet-**\$2,500- The funding will be used to support the Holidays for Heroes Toy Drive and Veterans Resource Event, an event that provides toys to children of military families in need.
10. **Temecula Sunrise Rotary Foundation-**\$2,500- The funding will be used to support the Community Christmas Dinner that provides a Christmas dinner to housebound seniors and low-income families.
11. **St. Martha's Food Pantry-**\$10,000- The funding will be used to support the purchase of food for the community pantry, that provides food assistance to low-income families.

12. **Sale Ranch Animal Sanctuary**-\$1,000- The funding will be used to support the Denim and Diamonds Gala, an event that raises funds for the animal sanctuary.
13. **Menifee Interfaith and Community Service Council**-\$2,500- The funding will support the Thanksgiving Day Senior Breakfast, an event that serves breakfast to over 300 seniors, veterans, law enforcement personnel, and individuals in need.
14. **Community First Church of God** -\$5,000- The funding will be used to provide emergency food boxes to low-income families.
15. **Green Acres Interactive Therapy**-\$3,000- The funding will support the Pony Up Gait Program, which provides physical and emotional therapy through adaptive horseback riding lessons.
