BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The Regional Access Project Foundation (RAP) is receiving Community Improvement Designation Funds (CID) in the amount of \$10,000. Established in 1992, RAP supports nonprofit organizations in eastern Riverside County through funding, technical assistance, and capacity-building services that strengthen operations, sustainability, and community impact. Funding will support the NPO Centric program, which assists nonprofits serving vulnerable populations, including low-income families, seniors, domestic violence survivors, unhoused individuals, and communities of color, with a focus on improving health, mental health, and juvenile intervention services.
