**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

The Riverside County Community Action Partnership Commission (CAPC) was formally established by the Board of Supervisors to provide guidance on anti-poverty programming and funding, and to advocate for the needs of low-income communities and residents. The primary responsibility of the CAPC, as established by California Government Code Section 12752.1, is to collaborate with the Riverside County Community Action Partnership (CAP) in advising and guiding how the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding can have the most impact in assisting residents to improve their financial health within their respective districts. In accordance with Riverside County Board of Supervisors' Policy A-21, Advisory Boards, Commissions, and Committees, the CAPC advises the Riverside County Board of Supervisors in alignment with the Delineation of Powers Agreement between the Governing Board and the Community Action Partnership Commission.

The CAPC is a tripartite board composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) members representing three sectors: one-third (1/3) representing the Public Sector; one-third (1/3) comprising of low-income individuals or representatives of the low-income community; and one-third (1/3) representing the Private Sector, including members from business, industry, labor, religious groups, education, or other significant community interests. All members must represent a Riverside County supervisorial district and receive formal appointments by the Board of Supervisors.

**Low Income Sector Representatives:**

District 2: Doreen Soiberg - brings over thirty years of experience in computer technology, demonstrating a deep understanding of digital systems and user engagement. With her extensive background, she is well-positioned to help bridge the digital divide by empowering individuals with essential technological skills. Doreen's expertise and commitment to community advancement make her an excellent advocate for promoting the Tech for Success program and expanding its reach within local communities.

District 3: Marjorie McPike - is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) specializing in tax preparation and small business accounting. With a strong focus on helping entrepreneurs build sound financial foundations, she provides expert guidance in strategic planning, compliance, and fiscal growth. In addition to her professional practice, Marjorie hosts a podcast dedicated to empowering small business owners to elevate their financial knowledge and take their businesses to the next level. Her passion for education and financial literacy makes her a valuable resource for fostering sustainable business success within the community.

**Private Sector Representatives:**

District 4: Olga Ariana Rodriguez - is a lifelong Coachella Valley resident and a dedicated advocate for housing justice and community-led transformation.
