

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Crystal Roses (\$3,000) will support the organization’s mission to bring comfort and care to individuals facing life-threatening medical conditions, primarily cancer. Through their free “Comfort Tote” program, Crystal Roses provides blankets, lotions, and other comforting items, often delivered personally by volunteers who are survivors or caregivers themselves.
2. The donation to 100 Mile Club (\$5,000.00) will support over 250 Lake Elsinore area students in building healthy habits and confidence through movement. The program encourages students to run or walk 100 miles over the course of the school year, leading the effort to promote lifelong fitness and healthy habits among children.
3. The donation to the Chabad Jewish Community Center of Riverside (\$4,000.00) will contribute to the 2025 Chanukah Festival, a celebration that fosters cultural understanding and unity within the community. The event highlights Chanukah’s universal message of hope, light, and togetherness, bringing residents of all backgrounds together in the spirit of inclusion and connection.
4. The donation to the United States Navy League Corona-Riverside Council (\$4,000.00) will assist the council in providing meals and support for Marines stationed at Camp Pendleton, including the Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron and those at Camp Talega in Area 64. The funding will help with their

Thanksgiving Dinner, Pancake Breakfast, Quarterly Awards Luncheon, and Christmas Dinner, honoring the service and dedication of local military personnel.

5. The donation to the City of Corona (\$2,500.00) will support the 2025 State of the City, an event that highlights the city's progress, initiatives, and community vision. The State of the City serves as a vital communication bridge between local government and the community, ensuring that residents and stakeholders remain informed about the city's achievements, challenges, and priorities.
6. The donation to Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino (\$1,500.00) will assist in providing food to more than 250 local nonprofit organizations that collectively distribute over two million pounds of food each month to emergency food pantries, homeless shelters, and community soup kitchens across the region.
