**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Family Service Association (FSA)**, founded in the 1950s, serves over 21,000 individuals each year through programs addressing poverty, hunger, and health. The \$2,500 requested will support HOPE for the Holidays program, providing toys, blankets, clothing, and hygiene items to about 200 foster children in the County's First District. This initiative brings comfort and dignity to vulnerable youth, ensuring they experience hope and joy during the holiday season.
2. **Jurupa Valley Adopt a Family**, founded in 1993 by local firefighters, rooted in the mission to empower families and strengthen the community, the organization now operates five key programs focused on youth development, senior assistance, health and safety, and career support. The \$2,500 funds requested through will support the launch of a CPR certification program for Jurupa Valley high school students, grant dollars will be used to purchase CPR training equipment, educational materials, and instructor certifications.
3. **Mission Middle School in Jurupa Valley Unified School District** – is dedicated to helping all students develop the skills and attitudes needed for academic success and social responsibility. The \$2,500 requested will support Family Fun Nights, which strengthen community connections by providing meals, free resources, and family engagement opportunities, as well as the student incentive program that rewards improvement in academics, attendance, and behavior.
4. **Rubidoux High School** – hosts the Falcon Festival, to rebuild connections among students, families, and the community after the isolation of virtual learning, the festival promotes family engagement, student enrichment, and collaboration with local organizations. The event has grown rapidly, attracting over 500 attendees and supporting more than 19 student clubs through fundraising and outreach opportunities. The \$2,500 requested through this grant will support event logistics, family activities, community resource booths, and student performances to ensure the festival remains free and accessible to all.
5. **Martin Luther King High School** created the veterans program; King Remembers in 2001, to connect students directly with American veterans. The program's mission is to preserve veterans' stories, provide students with a living connection to history, and express gratitude to those who have served our nation. The \$1,500 requested through this grant will support the coordination of the 26th annual event in March 2026, including materials, technology, and logistical resources to record and publish veterans' oral histories. By sustaining this program, King High Remembers continues to bridge generations, honor service, and inspire students with the values of sacrifice, freedom, and civic responsibility.
6. **Pacific Crest Youth Arts Organization**, provides high-quality educational and performance opportunities that inspire and prepare students for leadership through the performing arts. The organization serves over 5,000 students annually, with programs ranging from its nationally recognized Drum and Bugle Corps to workshops and leadership camps. The \$6,280 requested will support the Leadership program held at Canyon Springs High School in Moreno Valley that trains high school band leaders in effective communication, teamwork, and rehearsal techniques. This program addresses the lack of affordable leadership training

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available to music students, particularly in lower-income communities across Riverside County

7. **Latino Network** is a community-based nonprofit founded in 1993, dedicated to addressing issues affecting the Latino community and promoting leadership, education, and civic engagement across Riverside County. The \$2,500 funds will support key community events and initiatives, including the Nuestra Navidad Annual Breakfast, the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial Breakfast, and the Latino Network Youth Leadership Conference, which provides college preparation, financial literacy, and scholarships to students.
