

BACKGROUND:

Summary

In 2011, Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill (AB) 109 and AB 117 into law, shifting certain California prison functions to counties. The legislation, known as the Public Safety Realignment Act, provided funding to counties to implement the changes and required the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to develop a plan and budget for each county.

The CCP Executive Committee has been active in this county since 2011 and comprises required representatives. Pursuant to Penal Code Section 1230.1 (b), which indicates the following for the CCP Executive Committee membership:

“(b) The plan shall be voted on by an executive committee of each county's Community Corrections Partnership consisting of the chief probation officer of the county as chair, a chief of police, the sheriff, the District Attorney, the Public Defender, the presiding judge of the superior court, or his or her designee, and one department representative listed in either subparagraph (G), (H), or (J) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 1230, as designated by the county board of supervisors for purposes related to the development and presentation of the plan.”

Paragraphs (G), (H), and (J) of Penal Code Section 1230 refer to the head of the county department of social services, the head of the county department of mental health, and the head of the county alcohol and substance abuse programs

According to Penal Code Section 1230.1, subdivision (b), the Board of Supervisors designates a representative. The position representing paragraphs G, H and J of Penal Code 1230 was filled by Assistant CEO of the Health System, Zarreh Sarrafian, and who will be replaced by the Director of Behavioral Health, Matthew Chang. This move is expected to bring great integration and improve navigation of solutions, particularly given the recent legislation impacting county health services.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The impact of the CCP on residents is significant, as it provides local direction and control over the transfer of certain state prison functions to counties. This change expands the scope of the executive committee's membership.
