

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **The Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House**, provides housing, meals, and emotional support to families with critically ill or injured children receiving medical care far from home. Serving Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. The IERMH has supported more than 29,000 family stays, with nearly half of guests coming from Riverside County. The \$2,500 requested will support the Adopt-A-Room program covering part of the room and board, allowing families to stay and be close to the hospital when receiving medical care far from home.
2. **Salvation Army** is one of the world's most trusted nonprofit human service organizations, with a long-standing presence in Riverside County providing critical support to individuals and families in crisis. The Salvation Army Riverside Corps operates HOPE House, a transitional living program that helps men who have completed substance use treatment successfully bridge the gap between recovery and independent living. The \$3,000 requested will support an enrichment day for HOPE House residents, providing a meaningful outing and shared meal that fosters community, emotional wellness, peer support, and renewed hope as participants continue rebuilding their lives.
3. **Riverside City Firefighters Foundation** provides critical support and dedicated resources for fallen firefighters and their families. Over time, the Foundation's mission expanded to include support for active, retired, and disabled Riverside City Firefighters and their families. This support ranges from ensuring access to mental health services and routine physical checkups not covered by the city. The \$2,500 funds requested will support participation in the Foundation's annual fundraiser, the Lucky Strike Bowling Tournament, which helps provide effective and tangible resources to Riverside Firefighters.
