

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Jurupa Valley High School (\$2,000.00) will support the school's Resource Fair, which partners with health agencies, community-based nonprofit organizations, and local small businesses to connect students and families with essential services.
2. The donation to Sunshine Haven Wildlife Rehabilitation (\$2,500.00) will assist with zoonotic disease detection and surveillance in rescued wildlife throughout Riverside County. Funding will be used for antibody and antigen test kits, microscopes, and related supplies to support on-site testing and timely reporting to public health authorities.
3. The donation to the Assistance League of Riverside (Corona-Norco Branch) (\$4,000.00) will provide funding for Operation School Bell, a signature program that provides new school clothing to students from very low-income families referred by the school district. Through volunteer-led shopping experiences at local retailers, students receive essential clothing to support school readiness and confidence.
4. The donation to Corona Heritage Foundation (\$5,000.00) will support educational programming and heritage preservation efforts at the Corona Heritage Park & Museum. Funding will enhance interpretive programming, student outreach through docent-led tours, and community engagement initiatives highlighting Corona's citrus heritage and early development.
5. The donation to Jurupa Unified School District – Department of Parent Involvement & Community Outreach (\$1,500.00) will support the Student Readiness Supply Reserve Project. This project will establish a centralized reserve of backpacks and essential school supplies for students experiencing economic hardship, housing instability, or unexpected need. The program helps ensure students have immediate access to critical materials necessary for academic participation and success.
