BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Friends of Leaps and Bounds (\$10,000.00) will support the 12th Annual Saddle Up for Pediatric Therapy event benefiting individuals living with disabilities. Leaps and Bounds provides therapeutic services including speech, occupational, physical, and hippotherapy using horses to improve mobility, confidence, and quality of life. Funding will help expand access to these specialized services for children and families throughout the region.
2. The donation to the Riverside County Youth Commission (\$5,000.00) will support the 28th Annual Youth Summit, a countywide youth leadership and civic engagement event. The summit provides high school students with workshops, leadership discussions, and opportunities to connect with community resources and local leaders. This event empowers youth to build leadership skills while encouraging civic participation and community involvement.
3. The donation to Riverside County Works (\$5,000.00) will support the 2026 Jamil Dada Character Excellence Youth Awards. This program provides educational scholarships to young adults ages 16–24 who have overcome significant personal barriers. The scholarships assist recipients in pursuing college, career training, and other pathways that support long-term success and workforce participation.
4. The donation to the Corona Chamber Foundation (\$5,000.00) will support the Memorial Mile March, a community event dedicated to honoring and preserving the memory of United States service members who have made the ultimate sacrifice. The event brings together veterans, families, and community members to recognize military service and promote patriotism and remembrance.
5. The donation to the Jurupa Area Recreation and Park District (\$5,000.00) will support the annual 3rd of July Celebration in Jurupa Valley. This community event brings residents together in a safe and welcoming environment that promotes civic pride, strengthens community connections, and provides accessible recreational opportunities for families.

6. The donation to the Riverside County Department of Public Social Services – Adult Services Division (\$4,000.00) will support the 2026 Elder and Dependent Adult Symposium. The symposium raises awareness about elder and dependent adult abuse while highlighting innovative strategies, programs, and resources aimed at prevention and protection. This event helps strengthen community collaboration and improve support for vulnerable populations.
7. The donation to the Independent Living Partnership (\$4,000.00) will support the Independent Travel Program for people with disabilities and older adults. This program addresses transportation barriers that often limit individuals' ability to access healthcare, employment, and community services. Funding will help provide resources that promote independence and improved quality of life.
8. The donation to MilVet (\$5,000.00) will support programs that assist veterans and service members as they transition to civilian life. Services focus on addressing challenges such as housing instability, unemployment, food insecurity, and post-traumatic stress. Funding will help expand resources and support services available to local veterans and their families.
9. The donation to the Riverside University Health System Foundation (\$2,500.00) will support the Pinwheels of Hope initiative. This program raises awareness about child abuse and neglect while promoting prevention efforts and access to supportive resources for families. The initiative encourages community engagement in protecting children and strengthening family well-being.
10. The donation to Inland Southern California 211+ (\$5,000.00) will support the Power of Partnership event, which brings together nonprofit organizations, government agencies, healthcare providers, philanthropic partners, and community leaders. The event highlights programs such as the 211 Closed Loop Referral System and shares updates on new initiatives and impact milestones. It also strengthens collaboration among partners working to improve access to critical community services.
11. The donation to Jack and Jill of America – Inland Empire Chapter (\$1,000.00) will support youth-focused programs that promote educational enrichment, volunteer service, leadership development, and community outreach in the City of Eastvale. These programs help prepare young people to become engaged leaders and active members of their communities.
12. The donation to the Rondo School of Discovery (\$4,000.00) will support the Rondo Art Walk and provide art supplies and enrichment opportunities for teachers and students. Funding will help expand access to arts education and provide creative learning opportunities for students who may otherwise face financial barriers to participating in arts programs.

The scholarship recognizes Corona-Norco Unified School District students and Key Club members who demonstrate exemplary character and commitment to community service. Funding will assist students in pursuing higher education and continued leadership development.

14. The donation to the Rotary Club of Corona (\$5,000.00) will support scholarships for local youth, students, and families. Funding will also help advance youth leadership activities, nonprofit service initiatives, and community improvement projects that benefit residents throughout the region.
