BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Canyon Springs Little League, established in 1987, was approved for \$2,500 in Community Improvement Designation (CID) funding to replace aging pitching mounds and improve safety for over 250 youth participating in baseball programs in the Fifth District.
2. H.E.L.P. (Hope, Empathy, Love & Prayer) was approved for \$2,500 to support the distribution of supplemental groceries to individuals and families experiencing food insecurity, addressing increased demand and reduced federal food allocations.
3. Moreno Valley Pop Warner Football League was approved for \$2,500 to support youth football and cheer programs, including equipment, uniforms, facility use, and scholarships for over 250 participants in the Fifth District.

4. Rivers & Lands Conservancy was approved for \$2,500 to support its Acorns to Oaks Youth Education Program, providing hands-on environmental education and restoration activities for underserved students.
5. Friends of Valley-Wide Foundation was approved for \$2,500 to support its Youth Scholarship Program, expanding access to sports and recreational opportunities for approximately 300 youth in the Hemet and San Jacinto communities.
6. Moreno Valley Unified School District's Multilingual Education Department was approved for \$2,500 to support districtwide events that promote student achievement, biliteracy, and family engagement.
7. Banning United for Public Safety was approved for \$1,500 to support its annual Community Day Event, promoting community engagement and strengthening relationships between residents and public safety agencies.
8. Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 223 and the Veterans Club of Sun Lakes Country Club were approved for \$15,000 to establish a permanent, ADA-compliant American flag retirement site at the Cherry Valley Grange, supporting veterans and community groups through ceremonial and educational use.
9. Community Health Systems, Inc. was approved for \$2,000 in Community Improvement Designation (CID) funding to support healthcare outreach services and the 2026 Holiday Smiles Event, which will provide toys, food boxes, and community resources to underserved families in the Fifth District. The program is expected to serve up to 400 individuals, expanding on prior efforts to support local families during the holiday season.
