Comments

There are more than 50 timeshare properties in Riverside County, most of them developed between 1978 - 1990. Many are insolvent, and many or most of the individually assessed timeshare interests are in default.

If all of the defaulted interests are offered at tax sale, and a party (like our firm) is willing to commit to purchase all of them, the county will realize substantial revenues and savings in these ways:

1. The county will receive substantial sales from the tax sale proceeds. Very few timeshare interests in older, insolvent properties are purchased at tax sale, so the Tax Collector unmotivated to advertise and offer them.
2. In most situations, the timeshare interests - there may be 52 - 104 interests per condominium unit - can be recombined into residential condominiums, thereafter saving the County substantial administrative costs in the assessment, billing, and collection of far fewer parcels.
3. The reclaimed property are likely to remain current in the payment of property taxes.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board's Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, ensuring that the Clerk's Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead "Elmo" projector at the Board meeting, please ensure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo. **Speakers are prohibited from bringing signs, placards, or posters into the hearing room.**

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. The Board may limit the public input on any item, based on the number of people requesting to speak and the business of the Board. Please step up to the podium when the Chair calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the "green" podium light will light. The "yellow" light will come on when you have one (1) minute remaining. When you have 30 seconds remaining, the "yellow" light will begin flash, indicating you must quickly wrap up your comments. Your time is up when the "red" light flashes. The Chair adheres to a strict three (3) minutes per speaker. ***Note: If you intend to give your time to a "Group/Organized Presentation", please state so clearly at the very bottom of the reverse side of this form.***

Group/Organized Presentations:

Group/organized presentations with more than one (1) speaker will be limited to nine (9) minutes at the Chair's discretion. The organizer of the presentation will automatically receive the first three (3) minutes, with the remaining six (6) minutes relinquished by other speakers, as requested by them on a completed "Request to Speak" form, and clearly indicated at the front bottom of the form.

Addressing the Board & Acknowledgement by Chair:

The Chair will determine what order the speakers will address the Board and will call on all speakers in pairs. The first speaker should immediately step to the podium and begin addressing the Board. The second speaker should take up a position in one of the chamber aisles to quickly step up to the podium after the preceding speaker. This is to afford an efficient and timely Board meeting, giving all attendees the opportunity to make their case. Speakers are prohibited from making personal attacks, and/or using course, crude, profane or vulgar language while speaking to the Board members, staff, the public and/or meeting participants. Such behavior, at the discretion of the Board Chair may result in removal from the Board Chambers by Sheriff Deputies.

I am writing to express serious concern regarding Chad Bianco's recent seizure of election ballots. This action raises significant legal and constitutional questions, particularly around probable cause, chain of custody, and the integrity of California's election processes.

am a voter in this county, and I am deeply concerned about the reported seizure of ballot boxes by the Sheriff under a search warrant for the purpose of conducting a recount.

Elections in California are governed by clear laws and procedures designed to protect the integrity, security, and public trust in our voting system. Recounts are not conducted through law enforcement actions—they are handled through established legal processes administered by election officials.
