SUBJECT: EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT: Ratify and Approve Agreement No. 22-10672 A1 for an additional amount of \$855,049 for the Health/Medical Emergency Preparedness Grant between The County of Riverside Emergency Management Department and the California Department of Public Health for the performance period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2027; All Districts [Total Aggregate Allocation; \$16,075,522] - 96% Federal 4% State

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Ratify and approve Agreement No. 22-10672 A1 between the County of Riverside Emergency Management Department and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) for the performance period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2027 for additional funding in the amount of \$855,049;
2. Authorize the Riverside County Emergency Management Department (EMD) Director, or designee, to sign any subsequent amendments or other grant related documents, as approved by County Counsel that do not change the substantive terms of the agreement nor exceed the approved aggregate amount of \$16,075,522; and
3. Authorize the EMD Director, or designee, to execute agreements, memoranda of understanding, amendments, or similar documents, for which no money is exchanged, with health care facilities, school districts or other public or private entities in furtherance of emergency preparedness efforts, such as storage of emergency equipment, supplies, sheltering or similar items for the period through June 30, 2027, as approved-as-to-form by County Counsel.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The purpose of the grant is to provide funding for medical emergency preparedness goals and objectives in accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) #5NU90TP922005-04-00 Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP), Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response's (ASPR) Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP), State General Fund Pandemic Influenza (GF Pan Flu), and CDPH guidance. These funds represent an integration of efforts across the funding streams.

The Budget Act of 2022 for budget year 2022-2023 provides \$3,044,095 annually to local health jurisdictions for public health workforce and infrastructure, otherwise known as the Future of Public Health Funding (FoPH). These funds are considered ongoing funds and part of the ongoing baseline state budget. County of Riverside Emergency Management Department (EMD) is seeking approval to accept the FoPH Funding Allocation for an additional amount of \$855,049 for a total amount of \$16,075,522 from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) for the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2027.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Local response partners, community organizations, healthcare facilities, faith-based organizations and numerous other preparedness/response-based organizations will be included in preparedness efforts to ensure the above-mentioned capabilities are implemented and to better prepare our communities for any health/medical disaster.

Additional Fiscal Information

There is no impact to County General Funds. The maximum amount payable under this agreement shall not exceed the total sum of \$16,075,522. The grant breakdown is as follows:
