**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

A public hearing is required to obtain citizens and stakeholders views on community development needs and proposed uses of Community Planning and Development (CPD) funding in the One Year Action Plan which includes Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). This is the initial public hearing for the 2026-2027 HUD CPD funding cycle. No formal action by the Board of Supervisors is necessary.

The Riverside County Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions (HWS) published a Notice of Funding Availability for CDBG and ESG program funding for 2026-2027 on September 25, 2025. HWS received ninety-five (95) proposals totaling \$7,599,343.64 in CDBG program funds. The proposed activities included public service, public facility improvements, rehabilitation, economic development, and others. The department also received fourteen (14) requests for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding totaling \$2,896,094.40. Proposals for the HOME program include: HOME New Construction (\$1,563,704.17); HOME Direct Ownership (\$350,000); HOME/CHDO Set-Aside (\$312,728); and HOME Administration (\$208,494). The combined cost for oversight of the programs (HOME, CDBG, ESG), general management, and administrative activities is estimated at \$1,700,000.

Pursuant to the County's Citizen Participation Plan and 24 CFR Section 91.105, HWS published the required public notices notifying the public of the comment period for the proposed 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan and the scheduled public hearing.

At a later date, staff will submit the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan to the Board of Supervisors for review and adoption. The One Year Action Plan will identify the specific activities selected for CDBG, ESG, and HOME. Congress has not approved the Federal FY 2026 appropriations, and therefore, HWS doesn't have the exact amount of funding the County will be receiving. Staff anticipate presenting the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan to the Board of Supervisors no later than July 14, 2026.

Upon completion of the citizen participation process, the review and consideration of comments, and the review and adoption by the Board of Supervisors, the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan will be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for review and approval. The County adopted One Year Action Plan is due to HUD no later than August 18, 2026.

The proposed activities under the 2026-2027 HUD-funded Community Planning and Development (CPD) programs are attached.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

It is anticipated that the County's 2026-2027 CPD combined allocation is estimated to be approximately \$9,900,000 for the CDBG, HOME, and ESG programs.

**Additional Fiscal Information**

No impact on the County's General Fund and no budget adjustment is required, as the funding is provided by HUD.

The Riverside County Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions hereby notifies the public, under 24 CFR 91.105(e), that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing to: 1) hear comments on community development needs within the County's HUD-funded Urban County program, and 2) hear comments upon the proposed uses of 2026-2027 HUD-funded CPD programs to address the identified community development needs. The public hearing is scheduled for April 28, 2026, at 9:30 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers, County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, 1st floor, Riverside, CA. The public may present oral or written comments during the public hearing.

Furthermore, the public may review and comment upon the proposed uses of 2026-2027 HUD-funded CPD programs, as well as comment upon community development needs, beginning on March 27, 2026. Comments may be submitted to the addresses below by 5:00 PM on April 27, 2026.

It is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will approve and adopt the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan at its regular meeting on or about July 14, 2026. The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan will then be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for review and approval on or about July 30, 2026. Please note that both the meeting date and time are subject to change.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY The primary objective of the County's CPD programs is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expansion of economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate incomes. The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan is a component of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan that must be updated annually. It provides detailed information on the resources the County expects to receive and the specific activities to be undertaken to meet the priority needs identified in the Consolidated Plan. Upon completion of the Citizen Participation process, the review and consideration of comments, and the approval by the Board of Supervisors, the County will prepare and submit the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

ANTICIPATED FUNDS Anticipated allocations to be received through FY 2026-2027 are estimated to be \$7,300,000 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, including the Metro City Program; \$2,000,000 for the Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) program, including the Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO) program; and \$600,000 for the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program. The County expects to utilize at least eighty-five percent (85%) of the CPD funds for activities that benefit low and moderate-income persons.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ONE-YEAR PLAN ACTIVITIES The County received ninety-five (95) proposals for the 2026-2027 CDBG funding totaling \$7,599,343.64. The proposed activities included public service, public facility improvements, rehabilitation, economic development, code enforcement, and others. There were fourteen (14) requests for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding totaling \$2,896,094.40. Proposals for the HOME program include HOME New Construction (\$1,563,704.17); HOME Direct Ownership (\$350,000); HOME/CHDO Set-Aside (\$312,742); and HOME Administration (\$208,494). The combined cost for the oversight of the programs (HOME, CDBG, ESG), general management, and administrative activities are estimated to be \$1,700,000.

DISPLACEMENT All planned CPD-funded activities will be designed to minimize the displacement of persons. The provision of relocation benefits to displaced persons and replacement of low-and moderate-income housing units that are demolished or converted to another use as a result of CDBG-funded activities will be consistent with the County's Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan and provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Act of 1970, as amended.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AND COMMENTS The County of Riverside initiated the 2026-2027 CPD Funding cycle in September 2025, with the publication of the Notification of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the CDBG and ESG programs. The County initiated the Citizen Participation Process in September 2025, with the notification to residents, Cooperating Cities, non-profit organizations, service providers, public agencies, and other stakeholders of the 2026-2027 CPD Funding cycle. The Citizen Participation process consisted of online submissions, public meetings in unincorporated communities to receive input from residents and others to identify and assess economic, community, housing, and social development needs in the communities.

PARTICIPATING COMMUNITIES The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Consolidated Plan includes the unincorporated areas of the County, the cities of Lake Elsinore, Murrieta, Palm Desert, Banning, Beaumont, Blythe, Coachella, Canyon Lake, Calimesa, Desert Hot Springs, Eastvale, Rancho Mirage, La Quinta, Norco, San Jacinto, and Wildomar.

IMPLEMENTATION The goals for the 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the Consolidated Plan include: creating affordable housing for those of very low, low, and moderate-income; providing homeownership opportunities for first-time buyers; improving conditions of substandard housing and rental housing; addressing farm worker housing needs; ensuring the availability of emergency shelters to address the needs of the homeless; creating housing opportunities for the elderly, especially the frail elderly; creating supportive housing or shelter for persons afflicted with HIV/AIDS; creating rental assistance through subsidy programs; providing short-term shelter for the mentally ill homeless; creating a suitable living environment by improving public facilities and services; and providing economic development opportunities for low- and moderate-income families.

Se prevé que la Junta de Supervisores apruebe y adopte el Plan de Acción Final de Un Año 2026-2027 en su reunión ordinaria alrededor del 14 de julio de 2026. El Plan de Acción Anual 2026-2027 será entonces remitido al Departamento de Vivienda y Desarrollo Urbano de EE. UU. (HUD) para su revisión y aprobación alrededor del 30 de julio de 2026. Ten en cuenta que tanto la fecha como la hora de la reunión pueden cambiar.

**RESUMEN EJECUTIVO** El objetivo principal de los programas de formación continua del condado es el desarrollo de comunidades urbanas viables mediante la provisión de viviendas dignas, un entorno de vida adecuado y la expansión de las oportunidades económicas, principalmente para personas de ingresos bajos y moderados. El Plan de Acción Anual 2026-2027 es un componente del Plan Consolidado Quinquenal 2024-2029 que debe actualizarse anualmente. Proporciona información detallada sobre los recursos que el Condado espera recibir y las actividades específicas que se deben llevar a cabo para satisfacer las necesidades prioritarias identificadas en el Plan Consolidado. Una vez finalizado el proceso de Participación Ciudadana, la revisión y consideración de los comentarios, y la aprobación por parte de la Junta de Supervisores, el Condado preparará

y presentará el Plan de Acción Anual 2026-2027 del Plan Consolidado Quinquenal 2024-2029 al Departamento de Vivienda y Desarrollo Urbano de EE. UU.

FONDOS PREVISTOS Se estima que las asignaciones previstas para recibir durante el año fiscal 2026-2027 son de \$7,300,000 dólares para el programa de Subvención Bloqueada de Desarrollo Comunitario (CDBG), incluyendo el Programa de la Ciudad Metropolitana; \$2,000,000 de dólares para el programa Home Investment Partnerships (HOME), que incluye el programa de Organizaciones de Desarrollo de Vivienda Comunitaria (CHDO); y \$600,000 dólares para el programa de subvenciones de soluciones de emergencia (ESG). El condado espera utilizar al menos el ochenta y cinco por ciento (85%) de los fondos de DPC para actividades que beneficien a personas de ingresos bajos y moderados.

RESUMEN DE LAS ACTIVIDADES PROPUESTAS DEL PLAN ANUAL: El condado recibió noventa y cinco (95) propuestas para la financiación CDBG 2026-2027, por un total de \$7,599,343,64. Las actividades propuestas incluían servicio público, mejoras en instalaciones públicas, rehabilitación, desarrollo económico, aplicación de códigos y otras. Hubo catorce (14) solicitudes de financiación de la Subvención para Soluciones de Emergencia (ESG) por un total de \$2,896,094.40 dólares. Las propuestas para el programa HOME incluyen HOME New Construction (\$1,563,704.17 \$); HOME Propiedad Directa (\$350,000); HOGAR/CHDO Reservado (\$312,742); y Administración NACIONAL (\$208,494). El coste combinado de la supervisión de los programas (HOME, CDBG, ESG), la gestión general y las actividades administrativas se estima en \$1,700,000.

DESPLAZAMIENTO Todas las actividades planificadas financiadas por el DPC estarán diseñadas para minimizar el desplazamiento de personas. La provisión de beneficios por reubicación a personas desplazadas y la sustitución de viviendas de ingresos bajos y moderados que sean demolidas o convertidas a otro uso como resultado de actividades financiadas por el CDBG será coherente con el Plan de Asistencia Anti-Desplazamiento y Reubicación del Condado y con las disposiciones de la Ley Uniforme de Asistencia para la Reubicación y Adquisición de Bienes Inmuebles de 1970, según sus enmiendas.

PARTICIPACIÓN CIUDADANA Y COMENTARIOS El Condado de Riverside inició el ciclo de financiación del DPC 2026-2027 en septiembre de 2025, con la publicación de la Notificación de Disponibilidad de Financiación (NOFA) para los programas CDBG y ESG. El Condado inició el Proceso de Participación Ciudadana en septiembre de 2025, con la notificación a los residentes, Ciudades Cooperantes, organizaciones sin ánimo de lucro, proveedores de servicios, organismos públicos y otros interesados del ciclo de financiación del DPC 2026-2027. El proceso de Participación Ciudadana consistió en envíos en línea, reuniones públicas en comunidades no incorporadas para recibir aportaciones de residentes y otras personas que identificaran y evaluaran las necesidades económicas, comunitarias, de vivienda y de desarrollo social en las comunidades.

COMUNIDADES PARTICIPANTES El Plan de Acción Anual 2026-2027 del Plan Consolidado 2024-2029 incluye las áreas no incorporadas del condado, las ciudades de Lake Elsinore, Murrieta, Palm Desert, Banning, Beaumont, Blythe, Coachella, Canyon Lake, Calimesa, Desert Hot Springs, Eastvale, Rancho Mirage, La Quinta, Norco, San Jacinto y Wildomar.

**FONDOS PREVISTOS** Se estima que las asignaciones previstas para recibir durante el año fiscal 2026-2027 son de \$7,300,000 dólares para el programa de Subvención Bloqueada de Desarrollo Comunitario (CDBG), incluyendo el Programa de la Ciudad Metropolitana; \$2,000,000 de dólares para el programa Home Investment Partnerships (HOME), que incluye el programa de Organizaciones de Desarrollo de Vivienda Comunitaria (CHDO); y \$600,000 dólares para el programa de subvenciones de soluciones de emergencia (ESG). Las propuestas para el programa HOME incluyen HOME New Construction (\$1,563,704.17 \$); HOME Propiedad Directa (\$350,000); HOGAR/CHDO Reservado (\$312,742); y Administración NACIONAL (\$208,494). El coste combinado de la supervisión de los programas (HOME, CDBG, ESG), la gestión general y las actividades administrativas se estima en \$1,700,000.

**DESPLAZAMIENTO** Todas las actividades planificadas financiadas por el DPC estarán diseñadas para minimizar el desplazamiento de personas. El Condado inició el Proceso de Participación Ciudadana en septiembre de 2025, con la notificación a los residentes, Ciudades Cooperantes, organizaciones sin ánimo de lucro, proveedores de servicios, organismos públicos y otros interesados del ciclo de financiación del DPC 2026-2027. El proceso de Participación Ciudadana consistió en envíos en línea, reuniones públicas en comunidades no incorporadas para recibir aportaciones de residentes y otras personas que identificarán y evaluarán las necesidades económicas, comunitarias, de vivienda y de desarrollo social en las comunidades.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit our request for CDBG funding for the 2026–2027 program year. I would like to clearly outline why this request is both critical and highly aligned with the County’s funding priorities.

The proposed project directly supports the core purpose of the Community Development Block Grant program—to provide **decent living environments, expand economic opportunity, and serve low- and moderate-income residents**. The Faith in Action of the San Gorgonio Pass (FIASGP) Community Resource & Navigation Center is a fully operational, high-impact service hub that already delivers these outcomes daily.

### **1. Direct Benefit to Low- and Moderate-Income Residents (Primary CDBG Objective)**

This project clearly meets the CDBG National Objective of serving low- and moderate-income (LMI) individuals. The Center serves over 1,500 unduplicated residents annually—primarily individuals experiencing homelessness, housing instability, unemployment, and lack of access to healthcare. Services such as housing navigation, benefits enrollment, and workforce support are exclusively targeted to income-qualified populations.

### **2. Immediate Impact with No Start-Up Risk**

Unlike many proposals, this project is **fully operational and implementation-ready**. There are no delays related to construction, permitting, or program development. Funding will immediately sustain an existing, proven service model that is already stabilizing vulnerable households across Banning, Beaumont, Cabazon, and surrounding rural communities.

### **3. Critical Gap Funding That Prevents Service Disruption**

Most of FIASGP’s existing grants limit the use of funds for facility rent. As a result, this request is not for new programming—it is to **prevent the loss of an essential service location**. Without CDBG support to cover the unfunded portion of rent, the Center—and the services delivered within it—are at risk of interruption or displacement. This makes the request both urgent and uniquely appropriate for flexible CDBG funding.

### **4. High Leverage and Cost Efficiency**

CDBG funds will support only 36% of the facility cost, while the remaining program operations are funded through multiple sources, including County contracts, CalAIM, workforce programs, and private

foundations. This demonstrates strong leveraging and ensures that a relatively small CDBG investment sustains a **much larger network of services and funding streams**.

### **5. Regional Service Hub Filling a Critical Gap**

The San Geronio Pass is an underserved region with limited centralized access points for coordinated services. The Center functions as a **front door to housing, health, and employment systems**, improving service coordination and reducing strain on County systems by stabilizing residents before crises escalate.

### **6. Alignment with Eligible CDBG Activities**

The project supports eligible public service activities, including homelessness prevention, healthcare access, job training, and basic needs support—all explicitly recognized under CDBG as allowable uses. It also strengthens community infrastructure by maintaining a stable, accessible service location.

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### **In Summary**

Funding this request does not create a new program—it **protects an essential, high-performing community asset** that directly advances the County's goals. It ensures uninterrupted access to critical services for the region's most vulnerable residents and maximizes the impact of existing public and private investments.

It is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will approve and adopt the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan at its regular meeting on or about July 14, 2026. The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan will then be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for review and approval on or about July 30, 2026. Please note that both the meeting date and time are subject to change.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY The primary objective of the County's CPD programs is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expansion of economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate incomes. The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan is a component of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan that must be updated annually. It provides detailed information on the resources the County expects to receive and the specific activities to be undertaken to meet the priority needs identified in the Consolidated Plan. Upon completion of the Citizen Participation process, the review and consideration of comments, and the approval by the Board of Supervisors, the County will prepare and submit the final 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Five Year Consolidated Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

ANTICIPATED FUNDS Anticipated allocations to be received through FY 2026-2027 are estimated to be \$7,300,000 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, including the Metro City Program; \$2,000,000 for the Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) program, including the Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO) program; and \$600,000 for the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program. The County expects to utilize at least eighty-five percent (85%) of the CPD funds for activities that benefit low and moderate-income persons.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ONE-YEAR PLAN ACTIVITIES The County received ninety-five (95) proposals for the 2026-2027 CDBG funding totaling \$7,599,343.64. The proposed activities included public service, public facility improvements, rehabilitation, economic development, code enforcement, and others. There were fourteen (14) requests for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding totaling \$2,896,094.40. Proposals for the HOME program include HOME New Construction (\$1,563,704.17); HOME Direct Ownership (\$350,000); HOME/CHDO Set-Aside (\$312,742); and HOME Administration (\$208,494). The combined cost for the oversight of the programs (HOME, CDBG, ESG), general management, and administrative activities are estimated to be \$1,700,000.

DISPLACEMENT All planned CPD-funded activities will be designed to minimize the displacement of persons. The provision of relocation benefits to displaced persons and replacement of low-and moderate-income housing units that are demolished or converted to another use as a result of CDBG-funded activities will be consistent with the County's Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan and provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Act of 1970, as amended.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AND COMMENTS The County of Riverside initiated the 2026-2027 CPD Funding cycle in September 2025, with the publication of the Notification of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the CDBG and ESG programs. The County initiated the Citizen Participation Process in September 2025, with the notification to residents, Cooperating Cities, non-profit organizations, service providers, public agencies, and other stakeholders of the 2026-2027 CPD Funding cycle. The Citizen Participation process consisted of online submissions, public meetings in unincorporated communities to receive input from residents and others to identify and assess economic, community, housing, and social development needs in the communities.

PARTICIPATING COMMUNITIES The 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the 2024-2029 Consolidated Plan includes the unincorporated areas of the County, the cities of Lake Elsinore, Murrieta, Palm Desert, Banning, Beaumont, Blythe, Coachella, Canyon Lake, Calimesa, Desert Hot Springs, Eastvale, Rancho Mirage, La Quinta, Norco, San Jacinto, and Wildomar.

IMPLEMENTATION The goals for the 2026-2027 One Year Action Plan of the Consolidated Plan include: creating affordable housing for those of very low, low, and moderate-income; providing homeownership opportunities for first-time buyers; improving conditions of substandard housing and rental housing; addressing farm worker housing needs; ensuring the availability of emergency shelters to address the needs of the homeless; creating housing opportunities for the elderly, especially the frail elderly; creating supportive housing or shelter for persons afflicted with HIV/AIDS; creating rental assistance through subsidy programs; providing short-term shelter for the mentally ill homeless; creating a suitable living environment by improving public facilities and services; and providing economic development opportunities for low- and moderate-income families.
