Since 2025, public reports and official statements say **more than 20 wild burros/donkeys have been injured or mutilated, with 13 attacks reported in 2026 alone as of this week.** Recent incidents have been concentrated in **Reche Canyon and nearby unincorporated Riverside County**, with earlier cases also reported near **Moreno Valley city limits.**

The injuries being reported are not all the same. Public reporting describes **arrow strikes, severe trauma, mutilation**, and in some cases injuries so serious that the animals had to be **humanely euthanized.** One widely reported victim, a young burro called **Cupid**, was found near **Pigeon Pass Road** with a **broadhead arrow** that punctured her lung.

Media reports also identify a geographic pattern. Reported arrow cases have been tied to **Pigeon Pass Road, Hidden Springs Drive, Greenridge Drive, and Reche Canyon Road.** Public concern has focused on the area near **Reche Canyon/Moreno Valley**, and some reports describe a specific cluster between **UC Riverside and nearby housing development.**

As to *what* is causing the injuries, there is still **no confirmed single explanation.** Some attacks clearly involved arrows. For more recent mauling-type injuries, officials and reporting indicate suspicion of **multiple dogs**, possibly roaming or intentionally brought into the area, while some reports also mention speculation about other predators. Authorities have not publicly announced a final determination or suspect.

The official public response right now is that **Riverside County Department of Animal Services is leading the investigation, the City of Moreno Valley is urging residents to report directly to Animal Services,** and public reporting also points people to the **Riverside County Sheriff's Department** for tips. Moreno Valley specifically said calling **9-1-1** for these cases may delay the response because the matter has to be routed to the correct agency.

The public facts suggest this is not just "one random event." It looks like a **pattern crime / recurring animal-victimization problem** with at least three overlapping possibilities:

1. **Intentional human abuse** using arrows.
2. **Dog-driven attacks**, whether by roaming packs or intentionally deployed dogs.
3. **Community interface problems** where people stop roadside, feed, film, crowd, harass, or accidentally condition donkey movement, creating both safety issues and opportunities for offenders. This last point is an inference from the roadside/community context and the repeated public concern around the Reche Canyon corridor.

STATE HUMANE SERVICES - SPCA

"Operation Safe Hoof"

1. Intelligence and case-building

Create one small internal team whose only job is to centralize information.

That team should maintain:

- a master incident log
- a hot-spot map
- date/time grid by location
- photo/video evidence archive
- witness/contact list
- veterinary findings log
- suspected vehicle/person/dog descriptions
- cross-reference to agency case numbers

Working zones:

- **Reche Canyon Road**
- **Pigeon Pass Road**
- **Hidden Springs Drive**
- **Greenridge Drive**
- nearby trailheads, pullouts, and areas where residents commonly stop roadside. These locations are drawn from the public reporting.

2. Field surveillance and directed patrol

Pattern-based deployment.

Run three patrol modes:

A. Visible education patrol

Marked presence during daylight and early evening in known stop-and-feed corridors.

Purpose: deter harassment, talk to the public, gather tips, hand out reporting information.

B. Covert observation

Use unmarked observation from lawful vantage points in the hot zones during the time windows when donkeys are most active and when roadside stop behavior is common.

Focus on:

- vehicles pulling off unexpectedly
- people approaching burros on foot
- unleashed or aggressive dogs

- archery gear or suspicious nighttime activity
- repeated vehicles in multiple hot spots

C. Remote monitoring

With property-owner permission where needed, deploy trail cameras or motion-triggered cameras covering:

- washes / game trails
- canyon access points
- informal pullouts
- fence gaps / openings
- repeat carcass or injury-discovery zones

The purpose is to answer a key question: **human offender, dogs, wildlife predator, or a mix?**

3. Community contact and education program

This should be structured, not casual.

Create a short **Burro Protection Contact Card** that tells people:

- do not feed from the roadside
- do not chase, corner, or attempt to pet the donkeys
- do not release or allow dogs to run loose near them
- if you see an injured burro, suspicious vehicle, suspicious person, or active attack, report it immediately to Riverside County Animal Services at: **951-358-7387**
- Moreno Valley says direct reporting to Animal Services is preferred because it speeds routing to the right investigators.

Our contact teams will politely engage people who stop roadside and sort them into three groups:

- supportive residents / feeders
- curious onlookers
- suspicious or hostile contacts

For supportive residents, gather intelligence:

- when they last saw the donkeys
- where they cross
- unusual vehicles
- loose dogs
- nighttime sounds
- recent carcass or blood sightings
- social media groups where incidents are first reported

For suspicious contacts, document:

- vehicle plate
- time/location
- direction of travel
- body-worn or contemporaneous notes
- whether dogs were present
- whether the contact was consensual or enforcement-based

4. Victim-response and evidence protocol

Every injured donkey call should trigger a standard response checklist.

Minimum response package:

- scene security and perimeter
- exact GPS / map pin
- wide / medium / close photos
- tracks, drag marks, blood pattern, scat, dog prints, tire marks
- note proximity to road, houses, trails, drainage channels
- identify whether wounds look puncture/penetration, tearing, bite trauma, slicing, or blunt force
- collect witness canvass within the immediate area
- request veterinary / necropsy input when available
- preserve chain of information for County Animal Services / Sheriff follow-up

This is critical because the big investigative gap right now is **cause attribution**. The more consistent your scene work is, the better chance you have of distinguishing:

- archery assault
- dog pack attack
- predator event
- postmortem scavenging after a human-caused injury

5. Enforcement and interagency coordination

Because Riverside County Animal Services is publicly identified as the lead investigator, Guardian SPCA is positioned as a **force multiplier with Law Enforcement capabilities**, not a competing command.

Standard coordination framework with:

- Riverside County Department of Animal Services
- Riverside County Sheriff's Department
- Moreno Valley Animal Services where city limits issues overlap
- State Humane Service SPCA

Our role:

- surveillance support
- witness development
- field canvassing – Investigation – Arrest if warranted
- public education
- photo/video documentation
- suspicious-activity reporting
- assist with cruelty case package development when evidence supports it

Public reporting indicates authorities have discussed **felony animal cruelty exposure** if someone is intentionally using dogs to attack the burros.

A practical 30-day action plan

First 72 hours

- Build one master case file and hot-spot map.
- Pull public incidents into a timeline.
- Assign one operations lead, one intel lead, one community lead.
- Draft a one-page field contact card and one-page incident form.
- Contact Riverside County Animal Services and Sheriff's Department to advise Guardian SPCA is available for directed support tied to burro incidents.

Days 4–10

- Start directed patrols in Reche Canyon / Pigeon Pass / Hidden Springs / Greenridge areas.
- Run dawn, dusk, and late-evening observation blocks.
- Start community canvass of residents, ranch properties, delivery drivers, utility crews, and regular commuters.
- Identify lawful camera placement opportunities on private land with permission.

Days 11–20

- Compare patterns:
 - day of week
 - time of day
 - road segment
 - type of injury
 - weather
 - loose dog sightings
 - repeat vehicles
- Push bilingual public-awareness messaging.
- Conduct weekend roadside education operations when traffic and public interaction are highest.

Days 21–30

- **Produce a short intelligence summary:**
 - top 5 hot spots
 - top 3 likely attack modes
 - vehicles/persons of interest
 - dog-related patterns
 - community recommendations
- **Meet with partner agencies and decide whether the next step is:**
 - increased covert surveillance
 - dog-owner enforcement focus
 - archery/offender profile focus
 - expanded community reporting campaign

This issue is best addressed through a coordinated team effort among Riverside County Animal Services, law enforcement, community partners, and State Humane Services – Guardian SPCA. The public record supports treating this as a serious and recurring animal-cruelty and public-safety concern centered in the Reche Canyon–Moreno Valley area, with evidence of arrow attacks, severe trauma, mutilation, and a strong possibility that dogs may be involved in at least some of these incidents.

By working together, we can combine community outreach, education, surveillance, and lawful enforcement in a way that strengthens the overall response while making the best use of available resources. As sworn peace officers with authority to investigate and enforce laws related to animal abuse, neglect, and cruelty, State Humane Services – Guardian SPCA can help provide added investigative support when needed, reducing the burden on deputy sheriffs and city police officers for basic criminal investigative work that may arise from information gathering. The shared goal is to identify those responsible, protect these animals from further harm, and reassure the public that meaningful, united action is being taken.
