On November 17, 2020, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (Board) directed the Executive Office to implement an Unincorporated Communities Initiative (UCI). The UCI is a focused, ongoing, and coordinated effort to improve the infrastructure and services provided to the residents of unincorporated communities, with emphasis on Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities. The program is funded through County General Funds which are budgeted annually to the Unincorporated Community Fund.

On December 15, 2020, the Executive Office presented a proposed framework for planning and implementation of the UCI. With the support of the Board, the Executive Office established a team of staff and department heads to facilitate the UCI program. Through March 31, 2021, the Executive Office Team held 15 community meetings and conducted online surveys to better understand community needs for services, infrastructure, and infrastructure maintenance. On May 25, 2021, the UCI Team presented the needs assessment to the Board.

On June 24, 2025, the Board adopted the FY25/26 Budget, which included the allocation of \$12,500,000 in General Funds to the Unincorporated Communities Fund. The \$12,500,000 was to be divided evenly between the five Supervisorial Districts for each Supervisor’s use within their unincorporated communities.

Based on the foundational work completed by the UCI Team, the recommendations of the Transportation Land Management Agency – Transportation Department, and further analysis by this office, \$700,000 in UCI funding for the First District will be allocated to the following project in the University City community.

1. College Boulevard Median Improvements – Improving the existing median with hardscape improvements along College Boulevard from Sycamore Canyon Road to a point approximately 200’ North of Kirkmichael Circle within the University City community.
2. Various Traffic Safety and Maintenance Measures – Funding for the implementation of enhanced traffic safety measures and maintenance activities along public roadways within the University City community

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

This project will enhance infrastructure and beautification for residents of the University City community. The project reflects strongly stated community preferences for improvements and beautification along College Boulevard.

The long-term goal of the Unincorporated Communities Initiative is to improve infrastructure and services to all our unincorporated communities. This is another early step to meeting that commitment.
