1. 2. Accept the FY2025 EMPG funding in the amount of \$548,741 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), awarded to the Riverside County Operational Area (OA) with the Emergency Management Department (EMD) as the lead agency, for the performance period of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2028; and
3. Authorize the Emergency Management Department to administer the grant including pass-through funds awarded to the OA.

**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program is to support comprehensive emergency management at the State, Tribal and local levels, and to encourage the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery capabilities for all hazards. Funding from this grant is available to all jurisdictions through the Operational Area. As defined in Riverside County Ordinance No. 533 (as amended through 533.7), “Operational Area Level’ means an intermediate level of the state emergency services organization, consisting of a county and all political subdivisions within the county area”. The FY 2025 EMPG Program’s allowable costs support efforts to build and sustain core capabilities across the Prevention, Protection, Mitigation, Response, and Recovery mission areas. All projects enhance and sustain Emergency Management Operations through the provision of equipment, personnel for the cities’ emergency response operations and emergency operation centers and provide training for emergency management personnel. All matching funds are the responsibility of the awarded agency or jurisdiction.

The amount applied for has been pre-determined by CalOES through a funding formula which considers both a base and the county population. On August 8, 2025, CalOES awarded the Riverside County Operational Area the FY 2025 EMPG subaward in the amount of \$548,741. As the lead agency, EMD will retain funding to administer the grant and the remaining will be distributed among the cities throughout Riverside County through an application and selection process.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

EMPG funds are used to sustain capabilities for the county-wide Emergency Management Program. EMD participates in many of the trainings and provides emergency management training and information. One such training is the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program, which teaches residents to be self-sustaining and have the ability to help their neighbor during a catastrophic incident. These trainings are offered on a regular basis and throughout the county.

**Additional Fiscal Information**

The EMPG grant is a federally funded dollar-for-dollar local cash or in-kind match. Each agency that is awarded funding is responsible for providing the dollar-for-dollar cash or in-kind match

requirement. The dollar-for-dollar match portion of funding dedicated to EMD will be derived from Emergency Services Coordinators' regular salaries as budgeted in the FY25/26 approved budget.

The OA uses the same type of formula as the state in order to pass funding through to participating cities and the OA accordingly. All cities are invited to participate in this grant program. The match for this pass-through amount will come from 100% City funds.

On August 8, 2025, Cal OES announced the FY 2025 EMPG Allocations, to assist subrecipients in planning their application.

Since September 2025, Cal OES received multiple versions of its FY 2025 EMPG Award from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) because of ongoing litigation, which affected the terms and conditions, stipulation on the State's population methodology, and shortening the Period of Performance (POP) from three years to one year.

On February 6, 2026, Cal OES received its updated FY 2025 EMPG Award from DHS/FEMA, which revised the terms and conditions, rescinded the stipulation on the State's population methodology, and restored the POP from one year to three years.

Subrecipients are encouraged to continue planning their FY 2025 EMPG. The final application will be due to Cal OES by April 30, 2026. The Subrecipient Allocation Letters, State Supplement, Standard Assurances, and Webinar Schedule will be forthcoming. Below are resources to assist subrecipients with the application:
