BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Western Center Community Foundation DBA Western Science Center**
- **\$10,000**- The funds will support the SEE Program, which provides high school students with field trips to the museum and science workshops where they learn about fossil research directly from scientists.

2. **Temecula Valley Chamber of Commerce- \$1,700**- The funds will support the Temecula State of the City Address, an event that brings together civic leaders and residents to highlight the City’s economic development initiatives, community programs, and accomplishments.

3. **VNW Circle of Care Inc.-\$10,000**- The funding will support the “Circle of Care’s Project,” a program that distributes groceries and other basic necessities to residents in the Temecula and Homeland area.

4. **Habitat for Humanity Inland Valley -\$1,000**- The funding will support “Hit Fore Home,” a fundraising event that raises money for the Home Repairs and Preservation Program, which assists low-income homeowners within the district by providing major exterior home repairs and maintenance at little to no cost.
